
REMEMBERING DENNIS LANGAN By GDI Communications Team

EMPOWER YOUR BUSINESS: SOCIAL MEDIA CERTIFICATE COURSE FOR MÉTIS ENTREPRENEURS

The Gabriel Dumont Institute (GDI) is excited to offer a transformative opportunity for Métis entrepreneurs to enhance their digital marketing skills through a partnership with Blue Moose Media's Social Media Certificate course. This comprehensive training course will equip participants with the tools to grow their businesses by creating engaging content, deploying strategic advertising, and building impactful branding. GDI first provided the certificate training in 2017 and has been revising and updating the curriculum to adapt and cater to the ever-changing digital marketing and e-commerce landscape.

In today's digital age, a strong online presence is vital for small businesses to thrive. Social media platforms are powerful tools for generating brand awareness, connecting with customers, building brand loyalty, and driving sales. For Métis-owned businesses, embracing social media can also help amplify cultural identity, reach rural customers, and foster deeper connections with their communities. Never have people spent more time being connected and interreacting with their digital devices.

With the growing integration of artificial intelligence (AI) in digital marketing, small businesses can create high-quality content more efficiently than ever before. AI tools (such as Chat GPT, among others) streamline the process of generating captions, designing visuals, and analyzing data to identify what resonates most with audiences. This course emphasizes using these cutting-edge technologies to maximize the impact of your social media efforts.

This program is divided into two immersive three-day sessions, totaling 48 hours of hands-on training with expert instructors. The first section reviews Social Media Fundamentals like implementing organic strategies, optimizing social profiles, and developing stand-out content. The second part dives into Social Media Advertising and how to craft compelling ads, design high-performing landing pages, and convert online visitors into loval customers. Graduates will leave with a certificate of completion, a comprehensive workbook, and tailored advice to apply directly to their businesses.

Within the first month of registration, all 30 seats were filled by Métis Nation—Saskatchewan registered small business owners. GDI completed the first session in Saskatoon in December 2024, and the participants are looking forward to the second session in January 2025. A Regina cohort will be offered in February and March 2025.

DTI EARLY CHILDHOOD EDUCATION STUDENTS TAKE LEARNING BEYOND THE CLASSROOM

In November, Early Childhood
Education II (ECE II) students from the
Dumont Technical Institute in
Saskatoon took their learning beyond
the classroom with an educational
field trip to Nutrien Wonderhub,
Saskatchewan's only children's
museum. This hands-on experience
allowed students to apply concepts
from their coursework in a unique,
real-world setting dedicated to
children's play and learning.

During their time at Nutrien Wonderhub, students explored how intentional play-based environments support children's development and were able to connect these observations back to their studies regarding the importance of play in early learning. Each exhibit within the museum is designed to foster curiosity, creativity, and social engagement in young visitors—a concept that students had discussed extensively in their ECE II coursework. Observing the ways children interacted with the exhibits highlighted, for the students, how effective play spaces encourage active learning and support developmental milestones.

The experience was further enriched by conversations with volunteer Early Childhood Educators at Wonderhub, who shared their own perspectives on creating educational programs that inspire and engage. These exchanges gave students practical insights into the roles of ECE professionals in designing inclusive and developmentally appropriate programming, directly linking to their learning objectives on the importance of child-led learning and responsive caregiving.

Through this field trip, students gained a deeper appreciation for the theories they are studying, seeing firsthand how play-centered spaces and educational programming translate into meaningful developmental outcomes for children. The Wonderhub experience strengthened their understanding of the critical role that ECE professionals play in crafting engaging, intergenerational learning environments and even provided an opportunity for the students to play and learn as well.

The past 18 months have brought significant changes to the GDI Library. In August 2023, the Regina branch relocated from its long-standing home on the University of Regina computer.

In June 2024, Nicolle DeGagné transitioned from the Prince Albert branch to a new position with the Saskatchewan Health Authority in Saskatoon, and Marilyn Belhumeur retired from the Regina branch after nearly 40 years of dedicated service. Remaining staff Karlee Puckey (Saskatoon) and Kim Kovacs (Regina) were happy to welcome some new faces:

While there have been many transitions, the Library remains committed to providing high-quality services to Institute staff, students, and the Michif community. Whether supporting Institute staff in their dayto-day work and professional development, or students with their educational and career pursuits, the GDI Library continues to prioritize the needs of the Institute community. In addition, our physical collections are open to the broader community, and our spaces welcome anyone interested in learning more about Métis culture and history.

Here are some services we offer:

- Lending of most physical materials and in-house use of the rest;
- Intralibrary loan of materials between GDI branches (current students and staff only);
- Access to thousands of licensed and open-access digital resources, including databases, journals, newspapers, and magazines (licensed materials are restricted to student/staff use only);
- One-on-one assistance with research (including genealogical research) and citation styles;
- Computers for in-library use, along with free Wi-Fi;
- Support for basic tech troubleshooting;
- Space for cultural activities (beading groups, storytelling, etc.);
- · Drop-in study and gathering spaces;
- Free course-related printing for students (personal printing available for a small fee);
- Space for in-class instruction or group work (please book in advance);
- Group information literacy instruction on topics like APA formatting, plagiarism prevention, evaluation of research sources, media literacy, genealogical research, etc. (Regina and Prince Albert);
- Self-checkout of library materials (Saskatoon and Prince Albert).

The GDI Library is dedicated to fostering a supportive and welcoming environment for our diverse community, and we can offer some of these services even if you're not located in close physical proximity to one of our branches. Please don't hesitate to drop by!
